With fairs opening across New York City throughout the week, planning is a must. Salon Zürcher AFRICA, New York

May 2 to 7, 2017

Opening: May 2, 6 to 8 p.m.

Closing Party: May 7, 5 to 7 p.m.

The 19th edition of this mini-fair features five participating galleries from Ethiopia, France, Kenya and New York. The fair's focus centers around African art.

Portal

Opening Reception: Wednesday, May 3 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Following its inauguration in 2016, Portal returns with its second edition, now set in Soho. Work by approximately 30 artists from the U.S. and beyond will be on view. Artists were selected through a combination of an artist Open Call and an invitational process for artists already associated with 4heads, a nonprofit producing Portal as well as the Governors Island Art Fair.

Collective Design

May 3 to 7, 2017

Collective Design fair returns for its fifth anniversary, showcasing contemporary design and art. The fair includes masterworks of the 20th and 21st centuries alongside experimental contemporary works. Collective Design seeks to foster dialogue on the creative process and the diversity of our material culture to build a growing audience for collectible design and art. In 2017, the fair will present a program of special installations, curator-led tours, and *Collective Conversations* featuring artists, gallerists, educators and cultural innovators.

CONTEXT New York returns for its second edition, presenting contemporary art at Pier 94, sharing a space with Art New York. Each fair is distinct with CONTEXT New York exhibiting 80 international galleries curated to encourage dialogue between artists, galleries and collectors. Like its Miami cousin, CONTEXT New York provides a platform for emerging and mid-career artists presented by new and established galleries. If intent is any measure, CONTEXT New York aims to present the next slate of artists to know. The fair, along with its sister fair Art New York, are both presented by Art Miami.

Art New York

May 3 to 7, 2017

VIP Preview: Wednesday, May 3 from 2 to 5 p.m.

Art New York presents its third edition featuring contemporary and modern art from the global market. Highlights include works debuting to the public along with high quality art from the primary and secondary markets. Returning to Pier 94, the fair shares a space with CONTEXT New York. Both fairs are produced Art Miami.

Taken together, the two fairs presented over 120 galleries from 50 countries presenting more than 1,200 artists—many who have exhibited previously at respected fairs including Art Miami, Art Basel, Design Miami, The Armory Show, Masterpiece, Expo Chicago, The Art Show and more.

Art New York will focus on quality work of masters from the modern, post-war and pop eras. Expect to find paintings, photography, prints, drawings, design and sculpture from masters including Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, Willem de Kooning and Ed Ruscha.

1:54 Contemporary African Art Fair

1:54 Contemporary African Art Fair returns for its third New York edition. The title of the fair references the fifty-four countries that constitute the African continent – the fair strives to represent the diversity of contemporary African art.

The 2017 New York edition will feature 19 galleries hailing from Angola, Cote d'Ivoire, France, Ghana, Italy, Kenya, Morocco, the UK, the US and South Africa, collectively exhibiting the work of more than 60 contemporary emerging and established artists. The art fair includes the educational and artistic program, FORUM, curated by Koyo Kouoh. Programs include lectures, film screenings and panel discussions with international curators, artists and art professionals.

Set on Randall Island overlooking the East River, Frieze New York has a focus on contemporary art from living artists presented by dynamic galleries set around the world. Expect aisles of art plus programs of Projects, Talks and Education. The fair also presents works by modern masters and contemporary artists of note who may no longer be living. Frieze New York is made up of the main gallery section; two curated sections: “Focus” and “Spotlight;” and the subsidized platform “Frame,” which presents installations throughout the fair. Frieze New York is the center of attention for the second art fair week held annually in New York City.

For the first time, SPRING / BREAK Art Show is presenting a second art fair in New York: BKLYN IMMERSIVE, a free exhibition comprised of site-specific installations and immersive works. The show continues SPRING/ BREAK's tradition of utilizing atypical exhibition spaces. Breaking from its tradition, the art fair is a curated exhibition of invited artists versus a curator-driven fair. The exhibition is inspired by themes of displacement and migration and Alejandro Jodorowsky's *The Holy Mountain*, a surreal 1973 fantasy film. Like its sister fair, BKLYN IMMERSIVE continues on view beyond Frieze New York Week until Sunday, May 14, 2017.
