"Cabaret" at North Fork Community Theatre

The North Fork Community Theatre presents a new production of "Cabaret," opening Thursday, May 18, 2017 in Mattituck on the North Fork.

Set in Berlin in 1931, the musical tells the story of a young American writer and his relationship with an English cabaret performer, set against the rising threat of the Third Reich. Showtimes are Thursday through Saturday at 8 p.m., Sundays at 2:30 p.m. A free pre-show reception at 7 p.m. on Thursday, May 18, will celebrate the opening of the show, which will run through Sunday, June 4, 2017.

In-Process @ The Watermill Center

The Watermill Center offers its next artist-in-residency presentations on Saturday, May 20, 2017 from 2 to 6 p.m. The afternoon features theater artists Sebastián Escalona and Josefina Dagorret, multidisciplinary artist Stacey Goodman and experimental film-maker Aneta Panek. During the afternoon, visitors have the chance to meet the artists and discover work in progress undertaken while at Watermill Center.

Sebastián Escalona and Josefina Dagorret continue the development of Extinct Rite – a research project that combines different languages of artistic expression including landscape, the body, site-specificity and memory, in order to return instinctive memory to the body. American artist Stacey Goodman develops his ongoing multi-disciplinary work *Dreams*, *Light & Liberation*. Goodman creates sculptural objects, video and performances that aim to re-contextualize historical photography of marginalized people and spaces using the imagination. Aneta Panek stages "Alchemy of Punk," a punk opera bringing together the greatest voices of classical opera, punk and industrial rock in an explosive spectacle that merges together elements of theater, music, video installation and live performance.

HIFF Film Screening at Parrish Art Museum

The <u>Hamptons International Film Festival</u> will present a screening of "The Diving Bell and the Butterfly" at the Parrish Art Museum in Water Mill on Saturday, May 20, 2017 at 3 p.m.

Directed by artist and filmmaker <u>Julian Schnabel</u> and adapted from the memoir of same name, "The Diving Bell and the Butterfly" tells the story of ELLE magazine editor Jean-Dominique Bauby, who learned to communicate solely by blinking his left eye after a massive stroke left him in a condition known as "locked-in syndrome." The film received numerous accolades at its release in 2007, including awards for Best Director at the Cannes Film Festival and Best Foreign Language Film at the Golden Globes.

Tom Waits Songs at Southampton Cultural Center

New York City cabaret singer <u>Marissa Mulder</u> will perform the songs of songwriter and singer Tom Waits at the Southampton Cultural Center on Saturday, May 20, 2017 at 7 p.m.

In "Tom ... in his words, the songs of Tom Waits," Mulder will sing selections from the legendary musician's discography, paying homage to the various stages of Waits's career, with songs from his most lauded releases to some of his lesser-known works. A Rock and Roll Hall of fame inductee, Waits' was known for his conjuring of jazz and blues influences in his work, which complemented his often darkly comic poetic lyrics.

Sag Harbor Cultural Heritage Weekend

The Sag Harbor Cultural District will present an array of events in its second annual Sag Harbor Cultural Heritage Weekend on Saturday, May 20 and Sunday, May 21, 2017.

This year's theme will be "Sag Harbor: Port to the World," a celebration of Sag Harbor's maritime history. At 9:30 a.m. on Saturday morning, there will be a historical reenactment of the Revolutionary War skirmish known as Meig's Raid. Weekend events in Sag Harbor will include: a traditional wooden boat building demonstration; free tours of the Custom House; art exhibitions; historical walking tour of Eastville; a marine "touch tank" at the John Jermain Library; a sculpture workshop using marine debris; a bossa nova concert; guided tour of Christ Episcopal Church; the story of Temple Adas Israel, Long Island's oldest synagogue; and a documentary screening, among other activities.
