Film Screening & Talk at Montauk Library

The Montauk Library presents the film screening of "Five-Finger Discount: A Crooked Family History" on Wednesday, June 14, 2017 from 7 to 8 p.m.

A new documentary was produced by Montauk filmmaker, Rosanne Braun, who introduces the film at the screening. The film is based on Helene Stapinski's best-selling memoir of the same title. Stapinski's extended family in Jersey City included swindlers, bookies, embezzlers and mobsterwannabes, according to the library.

The documentary combines the memoir with present day Jersey City to take viewers inside Helen's struggle to confront her family legacy and reinvent her identity without losing the family she loves, according to the <u>film's website</u>. "Five-Finger Discount: A Crooked Family History" premiered this year on WNET.

Parrish Gallery Talk with Curator Alicia G. Longwell on "John Graham: Maverick Modernist"

Parrish Art Museum Chief Curator Alicia G. Longwell presents "The Curator's View Gallery Talk: John Graham: Maverick Modernist" on **Friday, June 16, 2017 at 6 p.m.**

Focusing on the critically-acclaimed exhibition, Longwell will lead attendees through the exhibition galleries and provide insights into significant themes specific paintings. In her discussion, Longwell anticipates sharing anecdotes about the artist, who spent time in Southampton and East Hampton

in the 1950s and is credited for discovering Jackson Pollock.

"John Graham: Maverick Modernist" is the first comprehensive retrospective in 30 years of the provocative artist's work. The exhibition explores how Graham became a significant figure in the development of a distinctly American approach to art-making in the first half of the 20th century.
