David Salle at The Art Barge

The Victor D'Amico Institute of Art will host a conversation painter, printmaker and writer, <u>David</u> <u>Salle</u> on **Wednesday, June 21, 2017 from 6 to 8 p.m.** Salle will be the first guest in The Art Barge's 2017 Artists Speak series.

David Salle (b.1952, Oklahoma) is a painter who helped define the post-modern sensibility. Solo exhibitions of his work have been held at major museums and galleries worldwide, and his paintings are in the collections of numerous museums, both here and abroad. Salle is also a prolific writer on art. His essay collection "HOW TO SEE: Looking, Talking, and Thinking about Art" was recently published by W.W. Norton.

The Artists Speak series was started in 1983 as an invitational discussion with renowned artists about their life and work. Past participants have included Christo, Alfonso Ossorio, Chuck Close, Dan Flavin, Jack Youngerman, Audrey Flack, James Rosenquist, Elaine de Kooning, and many more. Last year's guests included Eric Fischl, Donald Sultan, and Laurie Anderson.

Live Jazz: Ralph Lalama at Bay Burger
