Written by twotime Pulitzer Prize winner and Tony nominee Lynn Nottage, the Bay Street production is directed by Bay Street's Artistic Director <u>Scott Schwartz</u> and stars Kelly McCreary as Esther Mills (McCreary currently appears on Grey's Anatomy as Dr. Maggie Grace on television's ABC network).
