Special Theatrical Presentation by the Jewish Film Festival

The Southampton Cultural Center's Third Annual Jewish Film Festival presents "The Resettlement of Isaac" by Robert Karmon on **Monday, August 21, 2017 at 7:30 p.m.**

The Playwrights' Theater of East Hampton's premiere staged reading of "The Resettlement of Isaac," is based on the true story of Isaac Gochman, a 17-year old from Rovno, Poland, who, in one horrific night, survives a Nazi massacre of his entire family along with 20,000 other Jews.

Thrust alone into the forest and the wilderness of war, Isaac finds the courage to fight back as a Russian partisan blowing up Nazi trains, and finds the passion to fall deeply in love with Anya, a Russian partisan nurse. Many years later in New York, the elderly Isaac is still haunted by the

memory of his first love. His only friend, a young German-American woman, is tormented herself by doubts about her father's role as a German soldier during the war. Deeply affected by Isaac's past, she becomes the loving caretaker of his memories after he is gone. The play confirms what Faulkner once wrote, "The past is never dead, it's not even past."
