Queen Esther Marrow Performs at the Southampton Cultural Center

Southampton Cultural Center presents "Queen Esther Marrow: Here's To Life!" on Friday, September 15, 2017 at 7 p.m.

Queen Esther kicks off her USA tour at the Southampton Cultural Center with "Here's to Life," a musical celebration and a jazz flavored evening.

The legendary <u>Queen Esther Marrow</u> has long enjoyed the status of an international star, performing in concert halls and theaters throughout Europe including audiences with the Pope, Royalty and several presidents. Her career began when she was discovered by Duke Ellington at 22 and joined the Civil Rights movement and toured with Dr. Martin Luther King, Harry Belafonte and others. Since then, she's appeared with Bob Dylan, Tom Petty, BB King, on Broadway and television and in films.

Mountainfilm Festival at Southampton Arts Center

The Southampton Arts Center presents the "Mountainfilm on Tour Southampton – Life on Earth" with two days of film screenings and programs on **Friday, September 15, 2017 and Saturday, September 16, 2017.**

Mountainfilm on Tour brings a selection of culturally rich, adventure-packed and inspiring documentary films curated from the <u>Mountainfilm Festival</u>, held every Memorial Day weekend in Telluride, Colorado. The touring film program features highlights from the film festival that explore themes aligning with Mountainfilm's mission to use the power of film, art and ideas to inspire audiences to create a better world.
