Capturing high levels of water sports action, the film tells heart-felt stories by some of the top surfers in a variety of styles. The film shared breathtaking sessions with international champions of big wave, progressive, kite, wind and stand up paddle (SUP) surfing and introduces some of the world's best surfers to its audiences.

The Eastville Community Historical Society presents a "Talk and Book Signing" with David Martine on **Saturday, September 30, 2017 from 2 to 4 p.m.**

David Bunn Martine will be speaking about and signing copies of his newly released book, "NO RESERVATION: NEW YORK CONTEMPORARY NATIVE AMERICAN ART MOVEMENT." Martine, of Chiricahua Apache/Shinnecock/Montauk heritages, is an artist and curator whose work is prominently featured in the current "Native Americans on Eastern Long Island" show at the Heritage House of the Eastville Community Historical Society in Sag Harbor, NY.

If you'd like to experience a bit of Native American culture firsthand, Martine leads a workshop on wigwams immediately beforehand from **11 a.m. to 2 p.m.** The workshop will feature a combination of traditional and non-traditional materials, discussing the use of wigwams and their importance to Native American history. Sessions are \$10 for adults and \$5 for children.

Last Public, Guided "Women of the Manor" Tours

Sylvester Manor presents one of the final "Women of the Manor" guided tours on **Saturday**, **September 30, 2017.** Tours will be held at **noon, 1 and 2 p.m.**

"<u>Women of the Manor</u>," is Sylvester Manor Educational Farm's first in-house exhibition at the Manor House. For over three centuries, the women of Sylvester Manor have been portrayed in paintings and photographs. This exhibition, drawn from collections in the Manor house, shares images and stories of several female Sylvester descendants, paying homage to the women, enslaved and free, who lived and worked in the house and on the grounds, located on Shelter Island, NY. Photographs of generations of women, along with letters, poems, and ephemera, illustrate their lives and their enduring connection to Sylvester Manor, its house and landscapes.
