Featured speakers in this edition include artist Kryn Olson and Margaret Garrett (also a dancer), composer and pianist Bruce Wolosoff, writer Elizabeth Robertson Laytin and Inda Easton, who is a singer, songwriter and storyteller. The Southampton Arts and Culture Committee (SHACC) will hold its next meeting on Monday, November 27, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. at Southampton Town Hall. Open to the public,

who are encouraged to provide feedback and comment on arts and culture on the East End, SHACC is an advisory committee to the Southampton Town Board. Committee members include artist Hope Sandrow, who is committee chair, with members Geoffrey Drummond, <u>April Gornik</u>, Dorothy Lichtenstein, Minerva Perez, Elka Rifkin, Brenda Simmons, Terrie Sultan and Shane Weeks, who each represents a cultural non-profit located in Southampton Town. The meeting begins on the front lawn of Town Hall with a Native American traditional chants and drumming led by Weeks (weather permitting). All are welcome.

Guild Hall received a \$50,000 grant from the Robert D. L. Gardiner Foundation to help digitize its permanent collection, announced the museum. The project will begin in January 2018 and is expected to be completed by June 2018. It will be managed by Jess Frost, Guild Hall Associate Curator and Registrar of the Permanent Collection.

TSR: The Southampton Review releases its Winter/Spring 2018 issue with a Launch Party in New York City on November 17, 2017 at The Southampton Arts Manhattan Center for Creative Writing and Film from 6 to 8 p.m. at 535 Eighth Avenue (near 37th Street). The literary journal features original contemporary literature, poetry, photography and visual art in each edition. The Southampton Review is published by <u>Stony Brook Southampton</u> MFA in Creative Writing program, offering courses in Southampton and Manhattan.

Artist and Illustrator Sage Cotignola has created album artwork for singer/songwriters Kyle Rogers and Virginia Marcs. Kyle Rogers's debut album, *Songs* was released in October 2017. Rogers, who grew up in The Hamptons, is the son of Hamptons Art Hub publisher Pat Rogers. *Climbing the Wall*, Virginia Marcs's premiere album, will be released on November 18, 2017 with a Record Release Show at the LetLove Inn in Astoria, NY. A solo show of paintings by Lee Krasner (1908-1984) debuts at Paul Kasmin Gallery in Chelsea, NY. Presented in collaboration with the <u>Pollock-Krasner Foundation</u>, "Lee Krasner: The <u>Umber Paintings</u>, 1959-1962" features a series of 24 paintings made following the deaths of her mother and her husband, Jackson Pollock. Suffering from insomnia, Krasner made the paintings at night and under artificial light. The show is on view from November 9, 2017 to January 13, 2018. Krasner lived and worked in East Hampton, NY in The Springs.
