Illustrated Presentation on The Charmed Life of James Cresson Parrish

The Southampton Historical Museum and Rogers Memorial Library presents "The Charmed Life of James Cresson Parrish" on **Thursday, November 16, 2017 at 11 a.m.** at Rogers Mansion.

The Southampton Historical Museum Executive Director Tom Edmonds and Manager of the Research Center and Archives Mary Cummings will explore the life of James Parrish. An illustrated presentation will draw on Parrish's 1916 diary, archived at the museum, as well as other sources, to offer insights into an era when the wealthy arguably enjoyed more privileges than at any time before or since.

OLA Film Festival

OLA (Organización Latino-Americana) of Eastern Long Island will hold its 14th Annual Latino Film Festival from November 17 to 19, 2017.

The 2017 film festival will present four screenings in three venues.

"Neruda" (Chile, 2016, 108 minutes), a film about a Nobel prize-winning poet and Chilean senator who became a fugitive in his own country, will be screened on **Friday, November 17 at 7 p.m.** at the <u>Parrish Art Museum.</u> Prior to *Neruda*, screening will be a Long Island premier of *Desde el Principio*, (*From the Beginning*, 2017, 11 minutes), with the director Miguel J. Soliman in attendance. The setting of the film is a dark, soundproof recording studio, where a conversation sparks between two voice actors who are coping with a shared tragedy.

In addition to the screenings at 7 p.m., a bilingual (Spanish/English) tour of the museum will be held at 5:30 p.m. and a reception with food and beverages will be held at 6 p.m. <u>Tickets</u> are \$12 or free with museum membership.
