Learn the foundation of this age-old craft with the modern twist of a frame loom. Create your own one of a kind hand woven wall hanging full of color and texture. Learn the basics, new tricks and techniques, and explore the endless possibilities to this relaxing art form.

"THE FINAL YEAR" (USA, 2017, 89 minutes), directed by <u>Greg Barker</u>, shows a look at the inner workings of the Obama administration's foreign policy team: Secretary of State John Kerry; UN Ambassador Samantha Power; Deputy National Security Adviser and presidential confidant Ben Rhodes; as well as National Security Adviser Susan Rice; and the President himself.
