Film Screening at Guild Hall

Hamptons International Film Festival and Guild Hall presents "NOW SHOWING: NOVITIATE" on Saturday, February 10, 2018 at 6 p.m.

"NOVITIATE" (USA, 2017, 118 minutes) is directed by Maggie Betts. Drawn in by the prospect of a higher calling despite her non-religious upbringing, Cathleen (Margaret Qualley), a teenager growing up in the early 1960s, finds herself among a group of young women who have devoted themselves to a training program within The Sisters of Blessed Rose convent. While their devotion is contrasted against the harsh realities of religious life, the sudden announcement of Pope John XXIII's Second Vatican Council provides a new question for both the students and their Mother Superior (Academy Award® winner Melissa Leo).

Winter Lecture Series Kicks off at Madoo

The Madoo Conservancy presents the "Winter Lecture Series: Our Waterways: Stacy Paetzel" on

Sunday, February 11, 2018 at noon in the Summer Studio. The talk will be held in the recently restored 1740 barn followed by a reception in the adjacent summerhouse.

The Winter Lecture series presents three talks with leading landscape architects, who will discuss their experience working in the bays, ponds, and oceanfront of the East End of Long Island. Each of the three talks will be moderated by Rachel Gruzen, MEM, LEED AP, an environmental planning consultant and educator. Gruzen currently coordinates <u>The Peconic Estuary Protection Committee</u>, an alliance of Eastern Long Island municipalities and agencies addressing water quality.

Sunday's Lecture features Stacy Paetzel, RLA <u>Marshall Paetzel Landscape Architecture</u>. Paetzel is a founder and principal of the Mattituck-based firm, which focuses on recreating and enhancing the natural beauty through site designs that incorporate habitat creation and native plantings.
