Cost: \$50 entry fee for up to five artworks maximum.

ARTIST RESIDENCIES

Heliker-LaHotan Foundation Residency in Maine - Submit by Tuesday, April 10, 2018

Seeking: Mid career artists of established talent for a three-week residency in Maine at the former home and studio of Jack Heliker and Robert LaHotan on Cranberry Island.

Residency Perk: Preference given to artists who ordinarily wouldn't have the chance to work in Maine for spots in July and August. Residency spots take place between June and October.

Details: Artists should bring along whatever materials needed as there are no artist supplies for purchase available on the island. The residency takes place in a complex of buildings that includes an updated 19th century farmhouse, three private heated studios and a storage barn located on a private shorefront with views of a tidal basin known on the island as "The Pool." Lawns and informal flowerbeds surround the buildings and terrace overlooking the water. Cell phones may not work in all areas and cars are discouraged.

Extra: \$40 application fee. If accepted, there is a residency fee of \$1,250.

Studio in the Park Residency at a NYC public park - Submit by Monday, April 23, 2018

Seeking: Artists or Artist Collectives living in New York City to carry out a community-engaged art project over the course of six weeks in either summer or fall 2018.

Residency Perk: Artist or artist collective receives use of a 150 square foot mobile studio space located in a NYC public park for six weeks and a \$3,000 stipend for art materials and support for event production and marketing.

Details: Artists can propose projects that align with their existing practice or in accordance with one of the following residency themes: Immigration, Neighborhood Change and Cultural Heritage. Residencies will be sited in Seward Park in Lower Manhattan; Railroad Park in Morrisania in the Bronx; and Flushing Meadows Corona Park, next to the Queens Museum. Artists must have lived in NYC for at least one year prior to applying.
