<u>George Bumann</u> is a renowned naturalist and professional sculptor living at Yellowstone Park's northern entrance in Gardiner, Montana. Listen and watch Bumann as he talks through a live sculpture demonstration. This participatory program provides insight into an artist's process, and explores the ways in which humans find meaning in natural experiences. #### **Celebrate Earth Day with Two Films**

Hamptons Take 2 Documentary Film Festival presents "2018 Spring Docs" on **Sunday, April 22, 2018.** "Mission Blue" (95 min) will be screened at **2 p.m.** and "Bird of Prey" (95 min) will be screened at **4 p.m.** Both films will be shown at <u>Bay Street Theater</u> in Sag Harbor, NY.

Fisher Stevens and Robert Nixon's documentary, "Mission Blue" serves as a biographical portrait of internationally renowned oceanographer and eco-activist Sylvia Earle. "In Mission Blue," we watch the 78-year-old woman dive with sharks in the sea and dodge fishing nets as she swims through the middle of a major fishing operation. The film offers a bold new view of the famed oceanographer whose pursuit of saving the ocean takes her all over the world. Carl Safina, who is featured in the movie will be in attendance to speak after the screening. Safina is an award-winning scientist, author and founding president of Blue Ocean Institute at Stony Brook University. Free admission. Reserve seats here.

"Bird of Prey," directed by Eric Liner is a documentary film from the <u>Cornell Lab of Ornithology</u>. The Philippine Eagle is a bird of extremes. It's the world's largest and rarest eagle, found only in the Philippines. Fewer than 800 individuals remain today. In 1977, cinematographer Neil Rettig filmed the first images of the Philippine Eagle in the wild, transforming the bird into a national symbol. The documentary follows Neil's return to the Philippines as he embarks on an expedition alongside a group determined to protect the eagle. <u>Tickets</u> are \$20.
