Early Feminist Artist Eunice Golden Speaks

[Eunice Golden](#) is an early feminist artist of the 1960s known primarily as a figurative expressionist. She has had a career spanning over five decades and evolving through a variety of mediums including painting, film, photography, performance, and most recently digital. [Gail Levin](#) is a Professor of Art History, American Studies, Women's Studies, and Liberal Studies at Baruch College and the Graduate Center of the City University of New York known for her biographies on Edward Hopper, Judy Chicago, and Lee Krasner.

Concerts: Haydn/Korngold

Bridgehampton Chamber Music Festival presents “Haydn/Korngold” on **Sunday, July 29, 2018 at 6:30 p.m.** The concert will be held at Bridgehampton Presbyterian Church.

[Korngold](#) was hailed as the musical descendant of Brahms. WWII intervened in his trajectory and brought Germanic Romanticism with him to California, shaping film soundtracks for generations to come. Similarly, Haydn exported his Germanic Classicism to London. Both composers exemplify the cultural impact artists make when they cross borders.
