Shakespeare's "Twelfth Night" in the Garden at Madoo

The Madoo Conservancy presents "Shakespeare in the Garden" on **Thursday, September 13, 2018 and Friday, September 14, 2018 at 4:30 p.m.**

The Castle Theatre Company from the University of Durham, UK, performs "Twelfth Night," one of Shakespeare's greatest comedies. Following a shipwreck, Viola is separated from her twin brother Sebastian. Disguising herself as a young boy she becomes a messenger between the local duke Orsino and the wealthy heiress he loves, Olivia. As the two nobles begin to fall in love with this mysterious 'boy', the other members of Olivia's household compete for her hand in marriage (and huge fortune!). Enter Sebastian, Viola's long lost identical twin, and chaos quickly ensues...

The performance marks Madoo's third Biennial Shakespeare in the Garden.
