1. Artists and Scholars in Conversation on Jack Whitten at the Met

The Metropolitan Museum of Art presents "MET Fridays - Reflections on Jack Whitten" on **Friday, September 21, 2018 at 6:30 p.m.**

Reflections on [Jack Whitten](#) will be moderated by MET curator Kelly Baum, co-curator of the exhibition "[Odyssey: Jack Whitten Sculpture, 1963-2017](#)." The talk will feature Kelly Baum, Cynthia Hazen Polsky and Leon Polsky, Curator of Contemporary Art at The Met, Associate Professor at Columbia University, Kellie Jones with artists [Melvin Edwards](#), [Martin Puryear](#) and [William T. Williams](#).

2. NY Art Book Fair at MoMA PS1

[NY Art Book Fair](#) returns for its 13th edition this week at [MoMA PS1](#). Presented by [Printed Matter](#), the art book fair opens with a Preview on Thursday, September 20, 2018 from 6 to 9 p.m. The fair opens to the public from Friday to Sunday (September 21 to 23, 2018).

Expect to find 365 exhibitors presenting zines, artist's books, antiquarian books and contemporary versions. The book fair has a full roster of programming including artist talks, performances, interactive workshops and more.

3. Independent Art Book Fair in Brooklyn

[Independent Art Book Fair \(IABF\)](#) offers its 3rd edition in a new location at the East River Waterfront in Brooklyn. The book fair is open to the public **Friday to Sunday, September 21 to 23, 2018** and hosts an After Parties After Hours on **Friday, September 21, 2018 from 6 to 10 p.m.**

IABF presents independent publishers, bookmakers and artists who offer projects, publications and editions from independent publishers, bookmakers and artists. 4. Equinox Performance Ritual at the Whitney

[The Whitney Museum of American Art](#) presents “[Sibyl Kempson: 12 Shouts to the Ten Forgotten Heavens: Fall Equinox](#)” on **Saturday, September 22, 2018 at 7, 8 and 9 p.m.**

The eclectic multi-media performance is the 11th “Shout” in the cycle of 12 rituals celebrating the Autumnal Equinox and preparing for the turning of the seasons, the fully staged dramatic performance is composed by Sibyl Kempson, a playwright, director and performer. The “Shout” features live music, a historically controversial character and a waltz in looped performances. The culmination of the Autumn Equinox will take place at **9:45 p.m.** in the Museum lobby.

5. Marathon “Analogy Trilogy” at NYU’s Skirball

NYU Skirball Center for the Performing Arts presents the “Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Company: Analogy Trilogy” in two marathon performances on **Saturday, September 22, 2018 and September 23, 2018 beginning at 3 p.m.**

On Wednesday, September 19, 2018 at 7 p.m., Bill T. Jones give a talk with NYC Dance Professor [Sean Curran](#).

Inspired by W.G. Sebald’s *The Emigrants*, the “Analogy Trilogy” was developed over the course of 4 years with dance, theater and oral history accompanied by live music compost by [Nick Hallett](#). This is a rare opportunity to see the three parts of the Trilogy performed as a whole. The run-time is 6.5 hours including a 45-minute intermission and 90-minute dinner break.
