Hampton International Film Festival

The Hamptons International Film Festival returns and runs from **Thursday to Monday, October 4 - 8, 2018** at venues in Westhampton Beach, Sag Harbor, East Hampton and Southampton in The Hamptons. This year's festival is filled with stars and includes five world premieres.

Centerpiece films include Sara Colangelo's "The Kindergarten Teacher" starring Maggie Gyllenhaal, and Joel Edgerton's "Boy Erased" starring Lucas Hedges, Nicole Kidman, Russell Crowe and Joel Edgerton himself. More information on all the centerpiece films can be found [here](#).

Bridgehampton Road Rally

The Bridgehampton Museum presents “The Bridgehampton Road Rally” on **Saturday, October 6, 2018 for the daylong event. The fun gets started at 10 a.m. for the public** with registration for participants starting at 9 a.m.

The 26th annual Road Rally is designed to celebrate Bridgehampton’s rich racing history. The day includes registration and judging in the morning, followed by a parade of vehicles, the Rally Race – including a poker game, historical trivia and a time component throughout – and the awards ceremony. The non-participating public is welcome to watch and enjoy refreshments and the Bridgehampton Museum grounds.

Registration and judging take place Saturday morning beginning at 9 a.m. on the William Corwith House grounds. Complimentary coffee, pastries and bagels will be provided to motorists. For the non-participating public, the early morning is the best time to view the historic vehicles, starting when the gates open at 10 a.m.

The parade begins at 11 a.m. and follow the 1949-1953 four-mile race loop. The Rally will begin at noon for newer cars and 12:30 p.m. for older, vintage cars. Participants will follow a 60-mile route taking about 3 hours to complete. The awards ceremony begins once results are tallied.
