This week also marks the return of the October Art Week and TEFAF Fall New York, which you won't want to miss out on. Fan of Petah Coyne? Head to Chelsea on Saturday.

1. Samia Halaby in Conversation at Guggenheim

As part of the Guggenheim's Conversations with Contemporary Artists series, Samia Halaby will talk about her creative process on **Tuesday, October 23, 2018**.

Samia Halaby, an abstract artist and scholar of Palestinian art, will talk with Sasha Kalter-Wasserman, the associate curator of the Guggenheim Foundation's Abu Dhabi Project. A pioneer in contemporary abstraction, Halaby will discuss her practice, rooted in the conviction that abstract painting reflects the motion in nature and has the power to inspire technology with new visual insights. The talk is part of the Arab Art and Education Initiative, a yearlong collaboration between more than fifteen leading New York and Arab cultural institutions, meant to foster a great understanding between the US and the Arab world.

2. "Everywhere All the Time" at BAM

BAM will present the New York premiere of Seán Curran's "Everywhere All the Time" from **Wednesday, October 24 through Saturday, October 27, 2018**.

In celebration of Seán Curran Company's 20th anniversary, the Irish choreographer and company will collaborate along with Third Coast Percussion, a Grammy-award winning, Chicago-based ensemble. Part of the 2018 Next Wave Festival, the performance will include new and classic work inspired by the primordial nature of percussion. The performance will include a reimagining of the

hallmark 2000 piece “Abstract Concrete,” followed by “Quadrabox Redux,” a quartet body percussion work featuring Curran himself. The night will end with the New York premiere of “Everywhere All the Time,” which is set to composer Donnacha Dennehy’s “Surface Tension” and inspired by the Irish bodhran drum.

Each performance will run about an 1 hour and 20 minutes and start at 7:30 p.m. Tickets start at \$25. To purchase, click [here](#).

3. Exquisite Corpse at the New Museum

The New School will host “Exquisite Corpse: Sarah Lucas and the Body in Pieces,” a conversation about the British artist’s work, on **Thursday, October 25, 2018 at 7 p.m.**

In response to the museum’s current exhibition, “Sarah Lucas: Au Naturel,” the panel will explore the surrealism, psychoanalysis, sexuality and abjection in Sarah Lucas’s recasting of the human form. Discussing the range of expressions from desire and disgust to violence and intimacy found in her corporeal sculptures, the panelists will also explore how her work engages with crucial debates about gender and power with the legacy of Surrealism. The panel will consist of artist Cheryl Donegan and theorists Jack Halberstam and Heather Love. Johanna Burton, the Keith Haring director & Curator of Education and Public Engagement at the New Museum, will moderate.

5. Petah Coyne Gallery Talk & Book Release

Sculptor Petah Coyne converses with Stephanie Buhmann, art critic, author and contributing editor at Artcritical, on **Saturday, October 27 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.** at Gallery LeLong & Co. in Chelsea. Afterwards, Coyne will sign the newly-released illustrated catalogue that accompanies her solo show on view “[Petah Coyne: Having Gone I Will Return.](#)”

The show presents new and recent work for Coyne’s first show solo in New York in nearly a decade. Buhmann’s most recent book “New York Studio Conversations Part II: Twenty-one Women Talk About Art,” published by The Green Box, includes an interview with Coyne.
