Exhibitions that look to the past made our picks of three new shows to see in New York Galleries this week. Exhibitions include retrospectives that explore defining motifs, seminal years and never-before-seen work. Another show connects with sound as disobedience and women pioneers of electronic music. CHELSEA

Cheim & Read Gallery: "Louise Bourgeois: Spiral"

November 8 through December 22, 2018

Opening Reception: Thursday, November 8 from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m.

Cheim & Read will present "Louise Bourgeois: Spiral," the gallery's ninth solo exhibition of the late artist's work.

The final exhibition in the gallery's current location, the show will explore the spiral motifs Louise Bourgeois (1911-2010) created in sculptures, paintings and drawings from the early 1950's until her death. The exhibition will feature works made from a diverse range of materials from wood and bronze to hemp and latex. Including a series of spiral word drawings made on blue paper in 1986, the show will show the importance and the range of the spiral in the artist's work.

Fridman Gallery: “Aura Satz: Listen, Recalibrate”

November 7 through December 14, 2018

Opening Reception: Wednesday, November 7 from 6 to 8 p.m.

Fridman Gallery will present “Aura Satz: Listen, Recalibrate,” the inaugural exhibition at the gallery’s new location.

Fridman Gallery opens its new location with a solo show of London-based artist Aura Satz. Her second exhibition with the gallery, “Aura Satz: Listen, Recalibrate” present a series of drawings, two sound sculptures and 16mm film that focus on recalibrating and listening through the voices of female electronic music pioneers as well as the way communication through sound signals can be symbols of disobedience and communication. The show features “She Recalibrates,” 2018, a series of drawings of hands of women who contributed to the development of electronic music, and *The Wail That Was Warning*, 2018, a sound sculpture that generates a spectrum of sounds oscillating between a growl, a moan, a howl, a wail, a scream and a siren.
