1. Final Performances: "A Comedy of Tenors" by Hampton Theatre Company in Quogue

Hamptons Theatre Company presents its final performances of Ken Ludwig's "A Comedy of Tenors" from Thursday, November 8, to Sunday, **November 10, 2018. Performances are held Thursdays and Fridays at 7 p.m.; Saturdays at 8 p.m. and Sundays at 2:30 p.m.** Dinner packages are available and an extra matinée will be held on Saturday, November 10, 2018 at 2:30 p.m. prior to the 8 p.m. performance.

Featuring several characters from his Tony Award-winning "Lend Me a Tenor," "A Comedy of Tenors" is set in a hotel suite in 1930s Paris and follows the fortunes of four tenors, two wives and three girlfriends as they struggle hilariously with outsize egos, mistaken identities, bedroom hijinks and madcap antics in preparation for a concert at a soccer stadium filled with impatient screaming fans.

Tickets are \$30 for adults 35 and older; \$20 for those younger than 35, for theater industry members, and veterans; \$10 for students under 21 years old; and \$25 for seniors. To reserve tickets, visit www.hamptontheatre.org, or call OvationTix at 1-866-811-4111.

2. OLA Presents The 15th Annual Latino Film Festival of the Hamptons

The 15th Annual Latino Film Festival features four film screenings in four venues on two Forks from **Friday, November 9, 2018 through Sunday, November 11, 2018**. Screenings feature special events, talks and panels.

Films are from Chile, El Salvador and Brazil and include drama, thriller and heartwarming films. All films are in Spanish or Portuguese with English subtitles. On Friday at 7 p.m., “A Fantastic Woman” screens at 7 p.m. at the Parrish and is followed by a Director Talk via Skype. On Saturday at 7 p.m., “La Palabra de Pablo” screens at Guild Hall, followed by a Q&A with actor Carlos Aylagas and director Auturo Menendez, who have been flown in from El Salvador for this screening.

On Sunday at 2:30 p.m., “Coco” screens in an all-ages film geared for families accompanied by the short film “My Fear” as well as a student exhibition on the Day of the Dead. The Latino Film Festival concludes on Sunday at 6 p.m. at Bay Street Theater in Sag Harbor with “Antes Que Eu Me Esqueca.”

Tickets range from \$10 to \$20, depending on screening and seating. The screening in Greenport is free.
