3. Recovered Memory: New York and Paris 1960-1980

<u>Frank Van Ripper</u> will discuss his latest book, "Recovered Memory: New York and Paris 1960-1980" at Albertine on **Saturday, November 17, 2018 from 4 to 5 p.m.**

4. Walking Tour in the Bronx

The Municipal Art Society of New York will host a walking tour of Westchester Square in the Bronx on **Sunday, November 18, 2018 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.**

The tour will take visitors on a guide of Westchester Square, one of the most historic area of the Bronx that still bears its origins as a colonial era village. The two-hour tour will give a comprehensive look at the history of the first families of the Bronx and the area's strong connection

to the Revolutionary and Civil wars. One of the tour's highlights is a visit to St. Peter's Episcopal Church, founded in 1693 and is a NYC Landmark and listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

5. Historic Gathering & First United Lenape Nation Symposium & Pow Wow

The First United Lenape Nations will hold a Pow Wow & Standing Ground Symposium at the Park Avenue Armory on **Sunday, November 18, 2018 from 1 to 9 p.m.**

The event is the first large-scale Lenape Pow Wow on Manhattan Island and the first congregation in the area of the dispersed Lenape elders since their forced migration in the early 1700's.

The Pow Wow will feature a dance competition for hundreds of dancers of all ages accompanied by drumming and singing groups. Featured performances include Aztec Dancers T'KarimaTicitl, Intuit Throat Singer Tanya Tagaq and Taino Dancers from the Kasibahagua Taino Cultural Sociey. The symposium will provide an opportunity to meet Lenape elders and hear the perspectives of academics and community leaders regarding key issues facing the Native American community.

Tickets are \$15 for for ages 13 and older and \$10 for seniors, students, military (with ID), and children ages 6-12. To purchase, click <u>here</u>.
