## Hamptons Doc Fest Hosts 11th Film Festival with a New Name

Hamptons Take 2 Documentary Film Festival rebrands as Hamptons Doc Fest in time for its 11th Annual Film Festival, taking place from **Thursday, November 29, 2018 to Monday, December 3, 2018** at Bay Street Theater in Sag Harbor, NY.

The five-day film festival kicks off Thursday Night at 8 p.m. with *Every Act of Life*, a tribute to playwright Terrence McNally, who will be featured in a Q&A with actor Harris Yulin following the screening. In addition to film screenings, awards and special programming, the Hamptons Doc Fest hosts a Gala on Saturday night at 7 p.m. where the Lumiere Career Achievement Award will be bestowed to Sheila Nevins, who will be interviewed by Marc Levin.

Artist Steve Miller and ecologist/author Carl Safina discuss the environment and Miller's new book Radiographic: X-Ray Photo Inventions on **Friday, November 30, 2018, at 6 p.m. at the Parrish Art Museum.**

The book features a forward by Safina and presents 20 years worth of Miller's art that explores the intersection between nature and culture, fostered through the lens of scientific technology, with the aim of allowing a new view for both. Miller's art practice includes painting, printmaking, photography and sculpture. He has worked with scientists worldwide with their contributions providing inspiration for his art. ## Ray Johnson Mail Art Explored in Curator Talk

Guild Hall hosts a Gallery Talk on **Sunday, December 2, 2018 from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m.** with Jess Frost, Associate Curator/Registrar of the Permanent Collection and curator of the exhibition "Please Send To: Ray Johnson."

Drawn from Guild Hall's Permanent Collection, the exhibition presents over 30 works by the reclusive artist, the majority which are Mail Art, a movement pioneered by Johnson in the 1950s.

During his lifetime, the artist would send small, mixed-media works to a network of fellow artists through the mail, instructing them to intervene in the original work or forward the materials to another person. Mail Art offered Johnson alternative modes of circulating ideas and gaining recognition, using a subversive method to disseminate art, images and foster connection.
