1. Theater - A.R. Gurney's "Love Letters" Opens

"Love Letters" opens on Friday, February 8, 2019 and runs through Sunday, February 17, 2019 at Southampton Cultural Center (SCC). Performances take place on Fridays and Saturdays at 7 p.m. and on Sundays at 2:30 p.m. on the stage of SCC's The Levitas Center for the Arts.

"Love Letters" relays the life-long relationship between two childhood friends who began writing to each other and childhood and continue the practice throughout their lives.

General admission is \$25 and \$12 for students with ID. Group rates are available. Brunch & Theater packages are \$45 to \$55 at Fellingham's or Claude's. The artists and themes of the Photorealist movement will be discussed in a Gallery Talk at the

Parrish Art Museum on **Friday, February 8, at 6 p.m.** The talk features Museum Director Terrie Sultan, Photorealist artist Yigal Ozeri, whose work is currently on view, and Louis K. Meisel, Photorealism expert who coined the term in 1969.

The talk takes place in the gallery featuring Photorealist works as part of the permanent collection exhibition "Every Picture Tells a Story."
