Guest Juror: Jocelyn Miller, Assistant Curator at MoMA PS1

Guild Hall's annual Artist Members Exhibition is accepting applications to its non-juried show **through February 18, 2019**, with the exhibition itself held from March 9 to April 6 2019 at the East Hampton, NY museum. This year's Guest Juror is Jocelyn Miller, Assistant Curator at MoMA PS1.

Winner of Top Honor is awarded a solo show at Guild Hall Museum's Spiga Gallery with awards given to artworks in a variety of categories.

The Guild Hall Artist Members Exhibition is the oldest non-juried museum exhibition on Long Island and one of the few non-juried members shows still offered.

This community-centered exhibition is an opportunity for Guild Hall to celebrate the artists who live and work here. Artists from every level of accomplishment participate as a way to show their support for Guild Hall and its role in the community life.

Jocelyn Miller

This year's exhibition will be judged by Jocelyn Miller, the Assistant Curator at MoMA PS1. Miller has been a member of MoMA PS1's curatorial team since 2011. She recently organized "Projects 106: Martine Syms" at The Museum of Modern Art (2017) and "Maria Lassnig: New York Films 1970-1980," and "Body Armor" (both 2018); "Past Skin" (2017); and "Meriem Bennani: FLY" (2016) at MoMA PS1.

She has co-organized solo exhibitions with Reza Abdoh, Naeem Mohaiemen, Ian Cheng, Mark Leckey, Cao Fei and Simon Denny, as well as career retrospectives of the artists Maria Lassnig and James Lee Byars, the latter both at MoMA PS1 and Museo Jumex, Mexico City. She also serves as Editorial Manager for MoMA PS1's curatorial department, overseeing museum publications, and served as Editor for the 2015 "Greater New York: Readers" series. She received her BA in Comparative Literature at Princeton University.

Guild Hall

Guild Hall, one of the first multidisciplinary centers in the country to combine a museum, theater, and education space under one roof, was established in 1931 as a gathering place for community where an appreciation for the arts would serve to encourage greater civic participation.

For nearly nine decades, Guild Hall has embraced this open-minded vision and provided a welcoming environment for the public to engage with art exhibitions, performances, and educational offerings. Art and artists have long been the engine of Guild Hall's activities and the institution continues to find innovative ways to support creativity in everyone.

Guild Hall presents eight to ten exhibitions each year, ranging from the historical to the contemporary, and focusing on artists who have an affiliation with the Hamptons. The Museum's Permanent Collection houses 2,400 works of art, with an emphasis on the 20th and 21st centuries in all mediums, from painting, sculpture and photography to video, and installation art by artists of the region.
