MUSICAL - "Man of La Mancha"

Hampton Theatre Company presents the final performances of the musical "Man of La Mancha" through April 7, 2019. Performances will be held on **Thursdays and Fridays at 7 p.m.**, **Saturdays at 8 p.m. and Sundays at 2:30 p.m.**

Inspired by the 17th century novel "Don Quixote," the classic Broadway show—with book by Dale Wasserman, music by Joe Darion and lyrics by Mitch Leigh—is widely considered one of the most enduring pieces of musical theater, having enjoyed four revivals in New York and providing one of the best known songs in the Great American Songbook, "The Impossible Dream." The Hampton Theatre Company production is co-directed by Edward A. Brennan and Diana Marbury. Musical direction is by Amy Federico McGrath.

Tickets are \$40 for adults; \$35 for seniors; \$30 for those under 30 years old and \$30 for veterans and theater industry members. An additional matinee performance will be offered during the final weekend of the production, on Saturday, April 6, 2019, at 2:30 p.m., prior to the regular 8 p.m. performance.

Parrish Art Museum screens "Home," a satirical short film by Sandy Perlbinder on the architectclient relationship followed by a panel discussion on **Friday, April 5, 2019 at 6 p.m.**

The film was a featured short at The Sundance Film Festival is followed by a panel discussion with Perlbinder, architecture critic Paul Goldberger, architect James Merrell, and psychoanalyst Robby Stein. It will be moderated by Museum Director Terrie Sultan.

Home (1989, NR, 7:40 minutes), directed by Perlbinder, tells the story of a tyrannical *starchitect* who imposes his absurd vision on an unsuspecting couple building their first home. John Glover stars as Erich Hochmann, a brilliant and trendy deconstructivist architect modeled after Peter Eisenman, whose arrogance extends beyond his students and associates to his well-heeled, social-climbing clients. The protagonist also references personalities such as Howard Roark from Ayn Rand's *The Fountainhead*, and Frank Lloyd Wright.
