

## **SOCIAL SCENE - OLA Opens Benefit Art Show at Southampton Cultural Center**

The sky poured streams of water and caused new ponds to form on many Hamptons roads but that didn't stop a crowd from turning out on Friday night, April 26, 2019, to support <u>OLA of Eastern Long Island</u> at its Opening Reception for its Benefit Art Show "ROOTS."

Held at the <u>Southampton Cultural Center</u> in Southampton Village, NY, the art exhibition and sale continues on view through May 5, 2019. Fifty percent of all artwork sales benefits the non-profit organization whose mission is to promote social, economic, cultural and educational development within the East End's Latino and Hispanic communities while fostering understanding and building bridges to the East End community at large, according to its <u>website</u>.

The Art Sale was curated by North Fork artists Amy Worth and Hector deCordova, who are both active in the North Fork art scene as gallerists, teachers and volunteers. "ROOTS," which remains open to visitors through May 5, 2019, features work by around 65 artists who each present a single piece.

Exhibiting artists include Darlene Charneco, Philippe Cheng, Phyllis Chillingworth, Andrea Cote, Janet Culbertson, Jose Oscar Molina, Toni Ross, Ursula Thomas, Garance Werthmuller and others.

A signed Eric Fischl Limited Edition Print of *WTF* and a lithograph by April Gornik were highlights of the Art Show, according to organizers, with Gornik's *Forest Light*, selling at the Opening. Several Fischl prints of *WTF* also sold with more available for purchase. Fischl is donating the entire \$1,200 pricetag to OLA. The Signed Edition is a limited run of 100 prints.

"OLA of Eastern Long Island has been, under the leadership of Minerva Perez, a dynamic force for good in our community," Eric Fischl wrote in an email. "She, like her organization, strive to give those people in our Latino and Hispanic community who are being singled out and mischaracterized as evil or stripped of their dignity have a place to go for help, security and guidance. My piece, WTF, tries to put the face of innocence onto an inconceivably brutish policy response to what can

only be described as a genuine human crisis."
