Festival of New Plays

Bay Street Theatre presents its annual new Works Festival from **May 3 -5, 2019 (Friday to Sunday)** at the Sag Harbor theater.

New plays are presented on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The line up includes the historical-inspired drama "My Lord, What a Night" by Deborah Brevoort; a futuristic-based story of sisters "Walden" by Amy Berryman; a story of the meeting of iconic music stars "Delmonico" by Jack Canfora; and wraps up with the fractured fairytale musical "Bliss" by Emma Lively and Tyler Beattie.

RISING CLASSICAL TALENT

The Parrish Art Museum hosts the New World Symphony on **Friday, May 3, 2019 at 6 p.m.** in the group's only Long Island appearance.

In a rare performance outside its home base in Miami, a New World Symphony (NWS) ensemble performs works by works by Franz Joseph Haydn (1732-1809) and three modern Czech composers as part of its Salon Series.

NWS, America's Orchestral Academy, prepares the most accomplished students from leading undergraduate and graduate music programs worldwide for leadership roles in professional orchestras and ensembles. The ensemble appearing at the Parrish features graduates of music programs at Carnegie Mellon University, The Eastman School of Music, The Juilliard School, New England Conservatory, Oberlin College, Princeton University, Yale School of Music, and others.

Degas on Film

The Hamptons International Film Festival screens “DEGAS: Passion for Perfection” on **Friday, May 3, 2019 at 8 p.m.** at the Southampton Arts Center.

The documentary journeys from the streets of Paris to the heart of an exhibition at the Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge, whose extensive collection of Degas’ works is the most representative in Britain. With exclusive access to view rare and diverse works, the film tells the story of Degas’ pursuit for perfection through both experimentation with new techniques and lessons learnt from studying the past masters. Directed by David Bickerstaff. Running Time is 85 minutes.

“The Public” by Emilio Estevez

Written and directed by Emilio Estevez, the film stars Estevez, Alec Baldwin, Taylor Schilling, Christian Slater, Jeffrey Wright, Gabrielle Union, Michael Kenneth Williams and Jena Malone. Set in downtown Cincinnati, an unusually bitter Arctic blast becomes the catalyst for a David versus Goliath story pitting the homeless against the police heightened by media speculation on what the real story is after a group of people stage a sit-in at a public library.
