1. Nancy Atlas Launches Concerts in the Park in Southampton Village

The Southampton Cultural Center's "Concert in the Park" Series opens for 2019 with a concert by Nancy Atlas on **Tuesday, July 2, 2019, at 6:30 p.m.** at Agawam Park in Southampton Village, NY.

Known for her raw, live performances and stellar songwriting, Nancy Atlas and her band, The Nancy Atlas Project, have opened for bands both local and internationally famous including Elvis Costello, Lucinda Williams, Toots and the Maytals, Jimmy Buffett, Crosby, Stills and Nash.

2. Screening of Vincent van Gogh Biopic at Guild Hall

6. Tony Oursler Exhibition Talk at Guild Hall

Guild Hall will host a Gallery Talk with exhibiting artist Tony Oursler on **Saturday, July 6, 2019 from 3 to 4 p.m., followed by a Private Members Reception from 4 to 6 p.m.** on the occasion of his solo show "Tony Oursler," on view from June 8 to July 21, 2019.

The solo show features art made in the wake of his site-specific installation *Tear of the Cloud*, which was on view at Riverside Park in October 2019. In a new series of work, Oursler delves into the subject of water and notions of "magical thinking" for the East End which incorporates glass, computers and water. Thematically, the element of water becomes a repository for belief systems as the artist references the development of cartography and the subsequent vanishing of sea monsters, Hollywood movies and evil maritime spirits, counterculture and the pseudoscience of water memory.
