BELLPORT

MARQUEE PROJECTS is exhibiting new works by [Daniel Bruttig](#) in "Wandering Rainbows." There will be an Opening Reception on Friday, August 2, 2019, from 5 to 8 p.m. with an Artist Talk taking place from 5 to 6 p.m. The show remains on view through August 25, 2019.

Interdisciplinary artist Daniel Bruttig explores the liminal space between sculpture and painting. This exhibition presents the current state of his ever-morphing body of work, where the fabricated, minimalist object fuses with both synthetic and natural readymade materials. Bruttig's paintings and sculptures deliver unexpected and sumptuous surprises via new forms abstracted through intensive material investigation.

The Heckscher Museum of Art

The Heckscher Museum of Art presents “Mort Künstler: ‘The Godfather’ of Pulp Fiction Illustrators” from August 24 through November 17, 2019.

Renowned as America’s premier Civil War painter, [Mort Künstler](#) established his career in the 1950s and 1960s as a prolific illustrator of popular men’s adventure magazines. The artist’s collaborations with pulp fiction authors included Mario Puzo, for whom he created the original visuals for “The Godfather” saga. Künstler’s larger-than-life role in the golden era of pulp fiction unfolds in more than 80 original illustrations from the artist’s private collection, almost all publicly exhibited for the first time.

STONY BROOK

The Long Island Museum presents “Gracefully Chic: The Fashions of Philip Hulitar” from July 27 through October 20, 2019.

This exhibition is the first major retrospective exhibition to explore the work and lasting influence of mid-20th century designer Philip Hulitar. Hulitar became known for his distinctively tailored and elegantly decorated cocktail dresses and evening gowns. Launching his label in 1949 after 18 years of success as one of Bergdorf Goodman’s chief designers and head of its women’s dress division, Hulitar quickly earned critical acclaim and a fervent following in New York and Long Island society.
