Weekends in The Hamptons continue to be vibrant with plenty of events and things to do. Making our list of the best things to do this weekend on the East End are an edgy theater performance, art talks, live music, film, a Shelter Island sunset cruise and more. All take place through Sunday, September 15, 2019, on the East End of Long Island.

1. Immersive Theater Project at Guild Hall

Guild Hall presents “Broken Bone Bathtub,” an immersive experience where the action takes place inside a bathtub, from **Thursday, September 12, 2019, through Sunday, September 22, 2019**, with performances taking place Thursdays through Sundays.

In the piece, performer [Siobhan O’Loughlin](#) musters up the courage to ask for help after a serious bike accident and shares her story. The audience takes on the role of her close friends, not only in listening but sharing in their experiences and assist the artist in the ritual of taking a bath. Audiences are limited to 10 people per performance, which takes place nearby Guild Hall.

Admission prices differ depending on performance times. Tickets are \$40 or \$38 for Guild Hall Members on Fridays and Saturdays at 7 p.m. and \$30 or \$28 for Guild Hall Members on Thursdays at 7 p.m., Fridays and Saturdays at 9 p.m. and Sundays at 3 p.m. Click [here](#) to purchase. 2. Gallery Talk on Helen Frankenthaler's Work

The Parrish Art Museum is hosting artist Amy Sillman to share her insight into the work of Helen Frankenthaler in an intimate talk at the Parrish Art Museum on **Friday, September 13, 2019, from 6 to 7 p.m.**

[Amy Sillman](#) is an abstract painter who shares similar points of inspiration and techniques as Frankenthaler. The talk will take place in one of the galleries featuring large-scale paintings in the exhibition "Abstract Climates: Helen Frankenthaler in Provincetown." The exhibition illustrates Frankenthaler's transition from Abstract Expressionism to a more allusive form of abstraction and offers new insights into the major role her work played in the development of Abstract Expressionism in America.

3. Vincent van Gogh on Film

The Pollock-Krasner House & Study Center continues its "Art on Film" series with a screening of "Vincent: The Life and Death of Vincent van Gogh" on **Friday, September 13, 2019, at 7 p.m.**

"Vincent: The Life and Death of Vincent van Gogh," 1987 (105 min.), is directed by Paul Cox and features the experimental technique of using only the voice of the painter (John Hurt). Considered an "expressive documentary," the film was described as "the most profound exploration of an artist's soul ever to be put on film" by the Village Voice. The screening is prefaced with an

introduction by film historian Marion Wolberg Weiss, Ph.D., who hosts the fall film series “Van Gogh on Film: Searching for the Real Vincent.”
