The Hamptons provides plenty of places to play from Southampton to East Hampton this weekend. Heading to Southampton this weekend? Southampton Village transforms to a walking pedestrian village on Saturday as part of SouthamptonFest. The fall festival features area museums and cultural centers offering interactive programming that's family friendly from Friday to Sunday. Making our list of the best things to do this weekend in The Hamptons are immersive theater, film screenings, a poster unveiling and more. Read on to discover where to go on the East End through September 22, 2019.

1. Immersive Theater Project at Guild Hall

Guild Hall presents "Broken Bone Bathtub," an immersive experience where the action takes place inside a bathtub, continues into its final week with performances held **Thursday through Sunday, September 22, 2019.**

In the piece, performer [Siobhan O'Loughlin](#) musters up the courage to ask for help following a serious bike accident and shares her story with the audience. Those attending take on the role of her close friends, not only in listening but sharing in their experiences with some assisting the artist in the ritual of taking a bath. Audiences are limited to 10 people per performance, which takes place nearby Guild Hall.

Admission prices differ depending on performance times. Tickets are \$40 or \$38 for Guild Hall Members on Fridays and Saturdays at 7 p.m. and \$30 or \$28 for Guild Hall Members on Thursdays at 7 p.m., Fridays and Saturdays at 9 p.m. and Sundays at 3 p.m. Click [here](#) to purchase. 3. Films & Discussion Exploring Shifting Perspectives on Cultural Heritage & Art

Guild Hall presents “Art Criticism: The Next Generation” on **Saturday, September 21, 2019, at 1 p.m.**

This program will screen four short films and one work-in-progress presenting arts experiences from a variety of ethnic communities including Native American, Afro-Brazilian, African-American and Caribbean-American. A panel discussion follows featuring millennial curators and journalists discussing the shifting understanding of cultural heritage. Shorts include “Digital Natives: Plains Indians at The Met,” “Free Blacks: DanceAfrica at BAM,” “#MovementIsRising: Museum of Impact,” “Millennial Realness: 2019 Whitney Biennial” and “Carnival Queens.”

5. Lee Krasner Poster Unveiling

The poster for this year's Hamptons International Film Festival, featuring Lee Krasner's collage painting, *Vernal Yellow*, will be unveiled by HIFF executive director Anne Chaisson at the Pollock-Krasner House on **Sunday, September 22 at 11 a.m.**

Vernal Yellow captures the joyful resurgence of growth after winter's hiatus, and illustrates the artist's trademark recycling technique, using collaged fragments of earlier drawings and prints to enrich the painting's voluptuous forms. The unveiling will include remarks by Ruth Appelhof, author of the forthcoming memoir, "Lee and Me." Light refreshments will be served and copies of the poster will be for sale for the benefit of HIFF.

"Toni Morrison: The Pieces I am" is an artful and uplifting documentary on the life and works of the legendary storyteller and Nobel prize-winner, who recently passed away in August. Directed by Timothy Greenfield-Sanders (The Black List, Lou Reed: Rock and Roll Heart) and a friend of Toni Morrison's for over 35 years. The film premiered at the 2019 Sundance Film Festival.
