The Emily Lowe Gallery at Hofstra University presents “Environmental Impact” from September 3, 2019, through December 13, 2019.

Addressing the consequences of human interaction with the natural environment, art exhibited depicts the ways recent human intrusion into the natural world has resulted in environmental concerns. Featured artists include Daniel Beltrá, Diane Burko, Edward Burtynsky, Janet Culbertson, Alejandro Durán, Steve McPherson, Alexis Rockman, Barbara Roux and Steve Rowell.

MARQUEE PROJECTS is exhibiting works by multidisciplinary artist Gabrielle Ledet in “Syrilla” from Friday, October 4, 2019, through October 27, 2019. An Opening Reception takes place Saturday, October 5, 2019, from 5 to 7 p.m.

Celebrated for her films, Ledet conjures thoughts of Basquiat and uses a variety of mediums in her art practice including animation, painting, drawing, sculpture, film and clothing to explore blackness and womanhood. In her first solo show, “Syrilla,” the New Orleans native reflects on her childhood and pays homage to her great-grandmother (Syrilla), her grandmother and the women who helped raise her.

Farmingdale State College's Memorial Gallery exhibits "Fall from Grace: Works by Hal Buckner" from September 15 to November 15, 2019. An Opening Reception and Special Lecture takes place on October 1, 2019 from 11 a.m. to noon and 5 to 7 p.m. respectively.

"Fall from Grace" is curated by Beth Giacummo and includes Buckner's cut-out wall sculptures which feature female forms that question where women fit into the context of art and history by revisiting art masterpieces from the Western canon and mixes with a contemporary female figure, according to catalogue essayist Alexandra Giordano from Farmingdale's Visual Communications Department.
