1. Climate Talk and Performance at Montauk Library

The Montauk Library is presenting “Climate Reality Amplified,” a multimedia musical presentation highlighting the scientific evidence of the climate crisis on **Thursday, November 21, 2019, from 5 to 6 p.m.**

The presentation and discussion are part of “24 Hours of Reality: Truth in Action,” an international conversation about climate crisis taking place November 20 to November 21, 2019. The program will allow Montauk and East End residents to respond to points of view associated with climate change.

The evening continues with a screening of the 2017 documentary “The Blessing” followed by a Q&A with directors Jordan Fein and Hunter Baker plus producer Laura Ball. The evening wraps up with a Harvest Pot Luck Dinner from 8 to 9:30 p.m. Season and locally sourced dishes are welcomed to share. Sassafras tea will be served.
