EAST ISLIP

Islip Art Museum - "Art at 50 Plus" is on view December 6, 2019 to January 6, 2020.

Opening Receptions were held on Friday, December 6, 2019, from 6 to 8 p.m. and on Saturday, December 7, 2019, from 2 to 4 p.m.

The open call exhibition is curated by Holly Gordon and sponsored by AARP. A sprawling show installed salon style, the exhibition presents work by nearly 150 artists selected in response to the theme "Life on Long Island - What it Means to Me."

STONY BROOK

Long Island Museum - "Seen & Unseen: Photographs By Imogen Cunningham" is on view through December 29, 2019 in the Main Gallery of the art museum.

The exhibition presents photographs by Imogen Cunningham (1883-1976), who was a member of the 1930s era photography group Group f.64, named after a small space found on a large format camera, along with fellow members Ansel Adams, Edward Weston, Henry Swift and others. An influential photographer in her own right, Cunningham's work is marked by noteworthy levels of technical skill combined with artistic invention, according to the museum.

[The exhibition](#) presents 60 silver gelatin prints that include portraits of famous visual artists, Hollywood stars along with botanical studies. The show is organized by The Imogen Cunningham Trust in association with the Photographic Traveling Exhibitions.
