Film screenings and special events dominate the first half of February 2020 in The Hamptons. We've picked the best things to do for your weekends through February 16, 2020. Read on to discover which events made our list.

1. Clyfford Still Documentary Screening & Talk at The Parrish Art Museum

The Parrish Art Museum will screen the documentary "Lifeline: Clyfford Still" on **Friday, February 7, 2020, from 6 to 8 p.m**. Following the screening, a talk with film director Dennis Scholl and artist Deborah Buck will be moderated by Parrish Museum Director Terrie Sultan.

"Lifeline: Clyfford Still" (2019, 77 minutes) takes an in-depth look into the life and work of Still, a significant contributor to Abstract Expressionism and the color field movement. The film creates an intimate portrait of the artist through archival material, found footage, and audio recordings.

2. Historical Film Screening & Alec Baldwin in Conversation at Guild Hall

Guild Hall screens the award winning historical drama "The Mission" on **Saturday, February 8, 2020, from 6 to 8:30 p.m**., followed by a Conversation about the film by Alec Baldwin.

Co-presented with HamptonsFilm, "The Mission" (1986, 2 hours, 6 minutes) follows Jesuit priest

Father Gabriel (Jeremy Irons) as he enters the Guarani lands in South America with the purpose of converting the natives to Christianity. He is joined by Rodrigo Mendoza (Robert De Niro), a reformed slave trader seeking redemption. When a treaty transfers the land from Spain to Portugal, the Portuguese government wants to capture the natives for slave labor. Mendoza and Gabriel resolve to defend the mission, but disagree on how to accomplish the task.

Told mostly through the artist's own voice, the film includes interviews with colleagues, family members and close friends who offer additional perspective on her life and art. It is directed by Daniel Traub. The screening is co-presented with Hamptons Doc Fest as part of the museum's The Artist's Lens series.

7. Documentary Screening and Panel at Southampton Arts Center

The Southampton Arts Center will screen the documentary "CONSCIENCE POINT" on **Sunday, February 16, 2020, at 5 p.m.** followed by a panel discussion.

"CONSCIENCE POINT" (2019, 77 minutes) covers the almost two-decade-long battle for Shinnecock Nation land preservation, pitting real estate development against environmental equilibrium and ties to the Shinnecock Nation's ancestral homeland. The film follows Shinnecock activist Becky Hill-Genia and documents the struggle. The discussion features Becky Hill-Genia, Shane Weeks, Bryan Polite, Kelly Dennis, Alli Jospeh, Tela Troge and moderated by Joe Shaw, Executive Editor of the Express News Group, who co-presents the event.
